35 Locations Available To Help Students Find Money For College

~Students will receive FREE expert advice and help completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid~

Tampa, FL- High school seniors and other college-going students will soon have an opportunity to get FREE help with complicated financial aid forms to help pay for college. Florida Association of Student Financial Aid Administrators along with higher education leaders and organizations throughout Florida have partnered to help college-going students find money for college by hosting [College Goal Sunday Florida](#) on **February 23 and February 24** from **2pm-5pm** at [various locations](#) throughout the state. The one-day event is designed to help students and families pay for college by providing free expert assistance with completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). A completed [FAFSA application](#) is required by the U.S. Department of Education and higher education institutions to determine student eligibility for federal student aid such as the Pell grant, work-study aid, and loans. The FAFSA can also determine student eligibility for state, private, and institutional aid. Students and families who need assistance completing the FAFSA form are invited to attend any College Goal Sunday Florida site on February 23rd or 24th, 2013 from 2pm-5pm for free assistance.
